Situational Report

Customers, partners, and employees: YKHC is here for you and your family. YKHC is making decisions related to COVID-19 based on guidance from the CDC, the State of Alaska and other experts. We are erring on the side of caution and in the best interests of our employees, customers and communities. YKHC is publishing a situational report to provide an update on our COVID-19 response and planning. [Here is this week's report.](#)

Testing Update

As of 4 p.m. April 16, YKHC has performed 82,519 tests — 77,142 are negative and about 168 are pending. Three specimens were rejected by a private lab.

- YKHC offers free COVID-19 testing without an appointment at the Bethel drive-thru testing site Monday-Friday from 4 to 5:30 p.m.

Positive Case Count

- As of April 15, YKHC confirmed a total of 5,209 positive COVID-19 cases in the YK Delta.
 - 48 of these total cases were residents tested out-of-region or were not infectious while here, but per State reporting protocols, will be counted as YK Delta cases.
 - 54 of these total cases are non-residents, so per State reporting protocols, the official State YK Delta case count will remain at 5,107.

Vaccination Update

- As of April 16, YKHC has vaccinated 12,085 unique individuals throughout the YK Delta.
- For communities who have agreed to publish vaccination data, here are the percentages of eligible individuals who have received their vaccine:

Recoveries

- An individual who has been *symptomatic* is considered recovered when 10 days have elapsed from when symptoms began, symptoms show improvement, and an additional 3 days have elapsed since their last fever.
- An individual who has been *asymptomatic* is considered recovered 10 days from their last test.
- Of the total 5,209 confirmed positive cases in the YK Delta, 5,152 cases are considered recovered, 32 remain active and 25 are deceased.

Situation Report

- During the week of April 9 - April 15, YKHC reported:

- For tests completed and returned between April 9 and April 15, there was a test positivity rate of 1% in the YK Delta.
- YKHC does not publish COVID-19 case statements on weekends or holidays. YKHC will publish case statements for weekends and holidays on the next business day. YKHC providers call and notify individuals of positive test results on weekends and holidays.

- On April 13, following guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation paused use of the Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccine.
