

Transmission risk level by sub-region

The CDC recommends using two measures to calculate the risk of transmission in a particular area — (1) the total number of new cases and (2) the percentage of positive tests, both over a period of the past 7 days. This table is a tool that can be used to determine current sub-regional risk level. Sub-regions are defined by the five Sub-Regional Clinic Service areas. The remaining villages fall into the Bethel area.



Vaccinations

YKHC strongly encourages all individuals 5 and older to receive their COVID-19 vaccination. COVID-19 booster shots are available to eligible individuals who received the Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine. Testing

In **Bethel**, drive-through COVID-19 testing is available in the parking lot in front of the CHSB, across the street from the hospital, 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. All people who have symptoms of COVID-19 or are close contacts of known positive COVID-19 cases are encouraged to get tested at the drive-through site. Close contacts and people showing symptoms of COVID-19 can schedule testing by calling 543-6949.

Testing is also available without an appointment on the first floor of the hospital between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Patients should enter through the main hospital doors (not the emergency room entrance).
