### COVID-19 Level

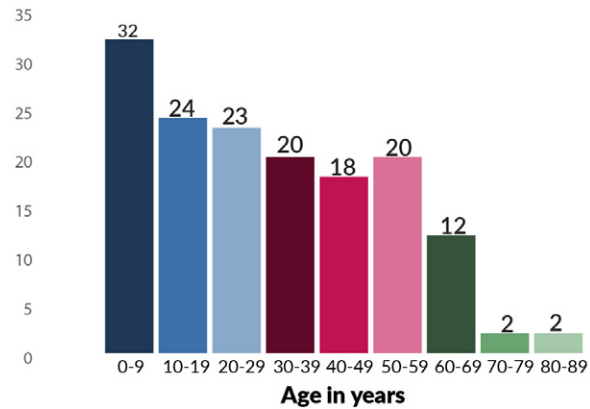
**MEDIUM**

### New cases announced in prior 7 days, by age

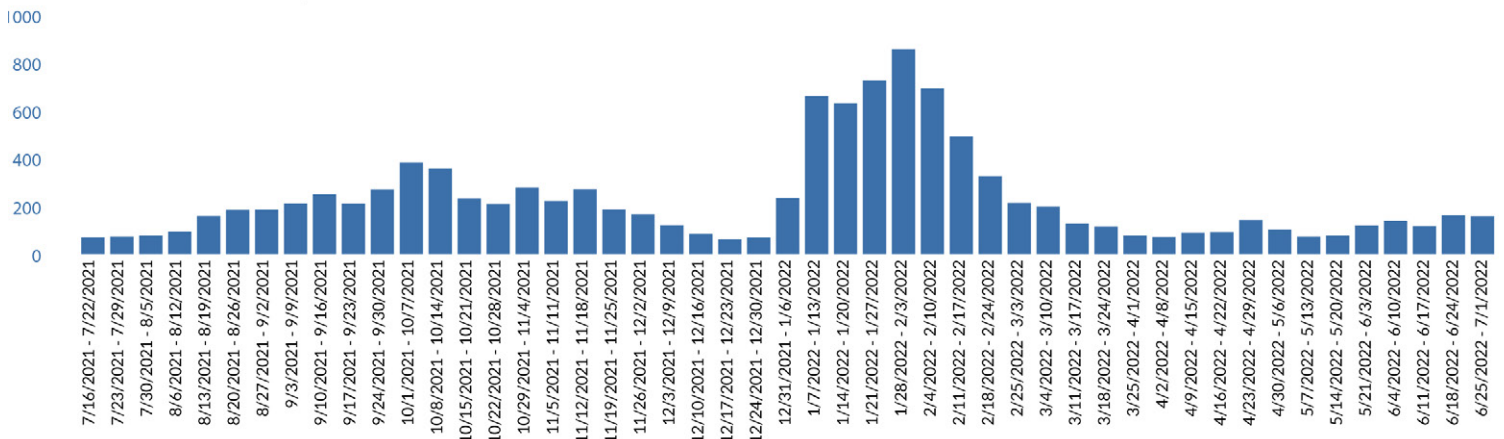

### Testing

If you tested positive for COVID-19 on an at-home test, please call YKHC Contact Tracing team at 907-543-6420, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, to report your positive result.

For COVID-19 testing **in villages**, call your clinic.

**In Bethel**, testing is available without an appointment on the first floor of the hospital. Binax tests are offered 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. PCR tests are available in the same location by request only during the hours of 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Please enter through the main entrance of the hospital.

### Announcements

- On Saturday, June 18, the CDC gave final approval for two COVID-19 vaccines for children ages 6 months to 5 years old. YKHC expects to begin offering vaccines to this newest age group on Wednesday, July 6. See our full statement [HERE](#).
