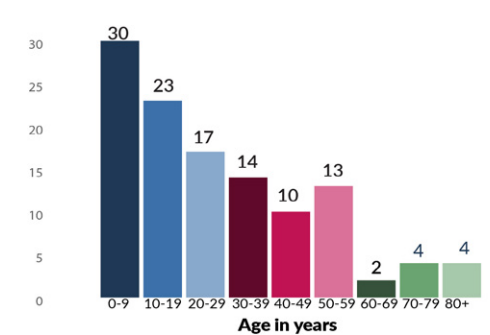

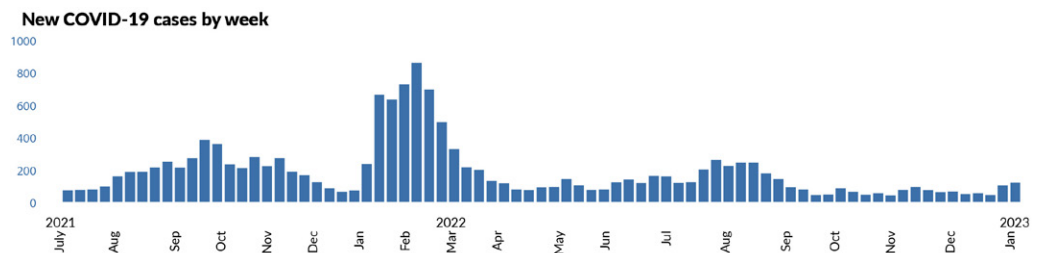
New cases in prior 7 days, by age

Announcements

Stay boosted! In September 2022, the CDC authorized a new COVID-19 booster, intended to better protect individuals from newer variants. This shot is recommended in addition to previous boosters. Most people ages 5 and older now qualify to receive this new booster and the extra protection it provides against serious illness.

Testing

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, including coughing, fever, body aches, new loss of taste or smell, you should be tested for COVID-19.

For testing in villages, please call your clinic.

In Bethel, at-home tests are available upon request at both hospital entrance desks. Please note, certain in-clinic COVID-testing requirements continue.

If you test positive for COVID-19 on an at-home test, please call the YKHC Contact Tracing team at 907-543-6420, between 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, to report your positive result.

Vaccinations

YKHC strongly encourages everyone 6 months and older to get vaccinated against COVID-19 and everyone ages 5 and older to [stay up-to-date](#) with their boosters, including the bivalent booster if eligible. For more information, please visit the [CDC website](#).
